





#### INTERVIEW WITH SARA PODGOREANU

# What made you start writing? Tell a bit more about you, where are you going to university?

I've always had a passion for writing. I always needed to write, weather that meant journal entries, or simple, incomplete stories on scrap pieces of papers that I would throw away after. My writing passion took a more concrete form during the pandemic when I began keeping what I was writing. It was also during that time that my stories turned more complex.

# How the schools helped you (creative writing courses, other examples)? Was there any other help you received to publish your debut novel?

Back in middle school, during our English classes we would also go over several writing techniques. For example, we studied how to write a balanced argument, or a graph analysis. Once, we also learned storytelling. Other than that, I didn't take any course. I perfected my writing simply by reading and analyzing other books and storylines.

To publish "Oblivion" I also received support from Claudia Marta, who successfully launched other children or non-fiction books with a great international experience. Her help was critical in publishing the book worldwide.

# What are your advices for teens willing to pursue a writing career?

I would say go for it. In my opinion, the world itself is composed of stories and narratives. People enjoy stories, they learn from stories, and use stories to unite those that are different. In fact, I think it's through stories that we can comprehend the world around us.

After all, you've got a utilitarian perspective and a personalized brand you're pitching. That's why one writes those books. So, just draft a distillation of your pitch and, Presto Chango, things are A-okay.

But what happens for those of you who've penned a heartfelt or jaw-dropping memoir? Or for those of you who've spun lovely children's tales? What about bodice ripping werewolf smut? — not a genre broadly known for bestowing pearls of wisdom but, in my view, that makes it an even more sumptuous vessel of transference.

In my case, I wrote an epic fantasy series featuring magic, mayhem, and malevolence... and evil cats. Isn't the whole point of such a story to free us from sales pitches and finger-wagging? Mm-maybe.


Okay. Let's all take a step back and acknowledge that heavy-handed preaching is a powerful antiaphrodisiac.

There are enough reasons to be sanctimonious in real life; I don't need my dwarves clamoring into gemstone pulpits to remind me of how banana plantations commit human atrocities.

Self-possessed preaching is never a good look, whether it's Jiminy Cricket teaching us how to avoid being struck by vehicles whilst crossing the street, or Madonna informing us how riches and fame don't solve problems after all. At least not all hers...

Anyhow, preachiness is like a quicksand. The more pages you spend courting the soapbox, the more likely you'll get caught in hypocrisy off the page later.

The paths of self-professed angels are of considerable heights and slippery, or so I hear...



Then again, a tale without any message, even an old message in new packaging, risks coming off as pointless, or worse, vapid. Nobody wants that either. There are already enough Michael Bay movies to have all our brains melt out of our ears.

Perhaps the biggest boogieman of all is this: if you're not clear on your message, you risk your readers (or perhaps your foes?) soothsaying your intended wisdom from your literary entrails. I'm here for ghoulishness of most varieties, but not this sort. I like my entrails inside. Point is... your violins rarely get to remain in the void.

Thankfully, as is most often the case, there are intermediate grounds, and you as the composer, budding author, and brand get to decide where you'll fall. Are you someone who's penned a series as a vehicle for their message? Everyone loves a pithy satirist. Or are you someone who found your message amid weaving the tale, having poetically written to think, rather than thinking to write? Or are you someone who, at the last, looked back at your literary journey, and only then perceived your mindset and moment for what it was, as ephemeral and beautiful as the cherry blossom? Maybe you're a little of each.



Regardless, as a reader and lover of human narratives myself, the story of how you came to know your message is as wondrous to me as the message itself. Maybe more so. I doubt I'm alone in that feeling either.

So, if you care to be a writer of any sort, then I say you articulate your message without self-con-

sciousness. Only *you* could have inked your tale, and yours is a worthy story. Share your message and make the tale of its discovery part of the broader saga. You are your most powerful literary device. Be you hero or villainess, leverage it and bust a move.



I will stay with the football analogy because there is an important message here. I will now liken internal voices to that of players on a team. I have never been in a huddle so I'm going to take some poetic license here.



The story included pictures of planets and asteroids taken from the internet. Everything was put together in a loose-leaf binder with a photograph of Ricky on the cover.

When the book was completed, it was seen on my desk by one of my tax clients who had recently created a company of self-published writers. "What's that?" he asked. I told him that I wrote a story for my grandson involving a trip through the solar system.


I am grateful for my fabulous team without whom I could not accomplish the publication and exposure of this unique series.

#### **FIVE STEPS TO SOLIDIFY YOUR PLOT**

re you struggling to define the plot in your story? Have you fallen into a plotting pitfall?

It's surprisingly easy to do.

All authors have seen the plot diagram. We know the six parts of a story are: Exposition, Conflict, Rising Action, Climax (Turning Point), Falling Action, and Resolution.

Can you see the diagram in your head? Now, sit down and plug your story points into the diagram. Sometimes, it's easier said than done.

Last year at WriterCon in Oklahoma City, I attended a seminar on plotting with Ally Robertson, acquiring editor for Wild Rose Press. It really helped solidify *Ascendant's* plot, the sequel to *Asylum*. The class was asked to answer these short questions and I thought I'd share them.

#### "Who is your Main Character?"

Because it's a sequel, I knew that already. Lacy is the main female protagonist and Jace is the male protagonist. They are a young pair who find themselves on the run from Lacy's uncle who wants to use them for his political gain.

#### "What is their situation?"

At the end of *Asylum*, Lacy and Jace are at the Texas/Mexico border. They've just decided to make a break for it when her uncle shows up and

stops them. In a heart-wrenching scene, they're separated.

#### "What do the main characters want?"

Lacy wants to get back to Jace, the love of her life, and find a way to be free from her uncle's tyranny. She needs to find enough leverage against her uncle to outweigh what he's using as leverage against them. In the sage words of Johnny Depp's character, Captain Sparrow, "Why fight when you can negotiate? All one needs is the proper leverage."

#### "What obstacles do they face?"

is probably one of the most important components of a novel. How excruciatingly painful can I, the omniscient author, make the situation for Lacy and Jace? Once I had that in mind, a second question followed. How can I make it worse? Lacy ends up kidnapped by a powerful Mexican human trafficker with no way out. Jace has been captured by Lacy's uncle and is forced to carry out certain black op missions for him.



#### "What must the main characters risk?"


Lacy must risk her life to escape and find leverage against her uncle in order to save Jace and finally find freedom.

Of course, there are subplots beneath the surface! But answering these five questions might make plotting your novel a bit easier.

Embracing the Magic is book 1 of the Town Magician series. A young boy, Samual, wants magic like so many people in his world, but he has



#### Do you deem yourself a pantser or plotter?

# Do you follow a rigorous writing routine? If not, when and how often do you write?

I've been trying to write every morning before work. Since I work from home, that seems possible, but many days I have so much to do I don't have time to write. This year I've been making sure I find a little time to write each day and it's been helping the stories progress much faster.





#### Was becoming an author a conscious decision?

Yes, very much so. I didn't write much when in school and never thought about it much afterwards. I love to read, but writing stories never was something I yearned for.

#### How do you juggle writing and other tasks?

I have to plan my days more. It seems silly, but I even plan what I will do for relaxing in an evening read, watch tv, play some music, whatever. If I don't, I will tend to let work take over and I don't write or do the things I love to do.

#### What are your hobbies and interests?

I like to read and watch movies and favorite television series. I play music, though I'm just now getting back into it after many years of not playing. I like video games, and am developing a workshop to teach kids video game storytelling.

### Have you faced any challenges hitherto as a writer?

Of course. Learning what makes a good story and a good sentence. Publishing and marketing it myself. Finding the time and motivation. All have been struggles, though they feel good now. I do continue to learn about writing better stories and everything I write is a little better than the last.

# What would you like to tell the budding authors who lose motivation if a few of their works do not do well?

Write a lot. Have more ready to go. Don't skip around all the time, but I have a couple things I'm working on. Once something is almost ready, I focus on it to finish, but I get excited to do the next one also.


#### If there is one thing that you would like to change in this world, what would that be?


# AGAINST ALL ODDS A STORY OF FAITH, COURAGE, AND NEVER GIVING UP

### Anthony Razzano

A single match was lit, igniting a fireball that would swallow a young Anthony Razzano whole. The garage didn't catch fire, but he did. Razzano was treated by paramedics from Noga Ambulance and taken first to Jameson Hospital's emergency room, but his injuries were so severe that he was flown by helicopter to West Penn Burn Center in Pittsburgh. There, doctors gave Razzano little hope for a life he barely even had the chance to begin. With third-degree burns over more than eighty-seven percent of his body, he was destined to become another statistic; In fact, at the time of Razzano's arrival at West Penn Hospital, the doctors gave him a mortality rate of one hundred percent.

Doctors told his parents that he would likely die overnight. But if he made it through the night, he would probably die within three days. Then, if he somehow fought through those three days, he would die in three weeks of infection. During that time, Anthony endured traumatic medical procedures, including the amputation of the fingers on his left hand. He also endured multiple bouts of sepsis where his temperature spiked to 106 degrees at one point, his blood pressure was 49 over 20, and his heart rate was 189 bpm for three consecutive days. At that point, doctors felt there was no other choice than to medically induce a coma to try to stabilize his vitals. After three more days of zero response to the induced coma and powerful antibiotics, his team feared that his heart would give out at any moment; he wouldn't make it through the night. Family members and friends held an all-night vigil, and the next morning—by some miracle—his fever broke, his heart rate stabilized, and his blood pressure rose.

Hanging on through multiple bouts of infection and respiratory failure as specialized surgeons performed twelve skin graft operations at West Penn Hospital's Burn-Trauma Center to graft healthy, un-burned skin from his scalp and feet onto his wounds. During the interim, when his scalp and feet were healing, his team resorted to a rarely-



used technique of skin grafts from cadaver donors onto various parts of his body, hoping that this would keep the wounds protected until they were able to replace with his own skin grafts—which had less likelihood of rejection. There was no hope—so they thought—with every overnight victory being written off as a new, albeit delayed, expiration date; Razzano's clock was ticking down, and the few days that they thought he had left would be full of pain and suffering. Last rites were administered three separate times, and his parents were told by





physicians to make funeral arrangements more than once.



Both Anthony and his family remained determined and resolute in their goal to help him live another day, every day for three months. Scarred and suffering pain like no other, having received 134 blood transfusions, he was alive and miraculously made it to his discharge date. What followed was three years of rehabilitation and six years filled with 43 additional surgeries.

Playing professional sports is in Anthony's DNA with 9 Superbowl rings in the Razzano family. No one believed he would ever play again, but survival wasn't enough for him. Anthony couldn't handle living his teenage years under the shadow of his injury. So, after he was released from the hospital, he continued to fight. A few years after the accident that forever changed him, Razzano became the starting outside linebacker for the New Castle Red Hurricanes under legendary coach Lindy Lauro.

By refusing to accept the odds or any limitations, he could live his dream of playing football.

Fast forward: Most people, by looking at Razzano, aren't aware that he lives in pain every day.

Anthony, now 47, is a loving husband and father, a successful businessman as a Certified Public Accountant and Certified NFL Contract Advisor. Now living in the sunshine state of Florida, he remains an integral and beloved community mem-

ber with a passion for youth sports and the power of living each day and playing as if it were your last.

With all of the lessons he's learned throughout his recovery and his fight to get back on the football field, Anthony has built a successful business advisory firm—Razzano Consulting, LLC—where he coaches entrepreneurs on the path to success, from startup to strategic operation.

His new business memoir, Against all Odds: A Story of Faith, Courage, and Never Giving Up, is a transformative memoir that serves as a beacon of light for those facing challenges.

Whether they are self-imposed barriers of the mind or major life-threatening trauma, Anthony's journey teaches us the power of adaptation, the importance of cherishing each opportunity, and the resilience of the human spirit.

y husband, Jay, and I have had many animals in the house with us over the years, including sick pigs, baby goats, disabled chickens, senior turkeys, an injured pigeon, an orphaned gosling, and a mouse with a head injury. But I will never forget the time we had a cow in the living room! That's right. We had a cow sleeping in our living room.

John Lewis Thunderheart, a calf we rescued from the slaughterhouse, was dying of pneumonia, and we knew we were losing him to the extreme heat in our quarantine barn. It was the middle of summer, and the temperature was at a scorching 106 degrees.

Jay and I looked at each other and shared the same idea: Let's bring him inside! We cleared the

furniture from the living room except for the couch, and I moved downstairs to become his mom.

I made warm bottles, cleaned up after him, spooned and cuddled him, and slept when he slept. I awoke every two hours to his face staring into mine letting me know he was hungry again, and the process started all over.Like any new mom, I did not sleep much for the first few months, but I treasure those memories as one of the best experiences in my life. I would not trade a second of it.





Eventually, with the help of donors sending packets of puppy pads, a homemade oxygen tent that Jay built, great veterinary care, and prayers coming in from around the world, Lewis healed, grew, learned to eat hay, and lived! Once he was cleared of pneumonia, the fun began. Jay and I took Lewis for hikes on the trails, to explore every inch of the barnyard, and to meet the other animals. He came when I called

him, walked beside me on a leash, raced around with our dog, Sky, his best friend, and seemed like any other ordinary, sweet, fun, large puppy dog.

I have been vegetarian since I was eleven years old and vegan for twenty-four years. Since I was a very young child, I could hear and understand animals. Animals have always been my greatest teachers, healers, and friends. But after having a cow in our house, raising him with love, and sharing so much time together, it is completely, one hundred percent clear to me that though some might perceive animals as different, the soul in each of us is the same! And every soul wants to heal other souls.

John Lewis is our youngest healer at The Gentle Barn. His love shows through to every human he comes in contact with. One woman had gone through cancer surgery during the pandemic and was not allowed to have any visitors in the hospital. Even the nurses were gowned and gloved and couldn't give her a proper hug during the hardest fight of her life. She had only her phone and social media for companionship.


That's when she found The Gentle Barn and started following John Lewis' recovery and story. Watching him struggle to heal, play even though he didn't feel well, and stay strong inspired her to stay strong through her own recovery.

She promised herself that if she made it, she would come and visit John Lewis and thank him personally. 

## **ROAD TRIPS IN NEW ZEALAND**

## New Zealand.

A tiny country at the bottom of the world.

A country that is on many peoples bucket lists.

I was lucky enough to first travel there in 1997 and then to emigrate permanently in 2010. It is a decision I will never regret.

Extracts from my book **Seventy Years Worth Of Travel**:

We have now travelled to Whakarewarewa "The Living Maori Village" as it is described in the guidebooks. For more than two hundred years, people of the Tuhourangi Ngati Wahiao have welcomed visitors from around the world. I had especially wanted to go here, as opposed to some of the other glitzier tourist attractions in Rotorua. At that time, in 2007, the village was still relatively unspoilt, much as it had been for the last 100 years.

After wandering around the geothermal landscape featuring hot spring lakes, bubbling mud pools and geysers, we stopped to enjoy a delicious piece of corn on the cob. It was apparently "a unique taste of kai (food) cooked in our largest hot pool."

Watching the traditional dance performances featuring *poi* (soft, hand held balls attached to a string) *patu* (a short club made of wood, whalebone or *pounamu* (greenstone) *raku* (wooden sticks) and much eye rolling and sticking out of tongues, I was particularly fascinated by one of the tall, male Maori dancers. It was easy to imagine his warrior ancestors doing the same Haka before going into battle. Later that day I saw him at the local store, buying a toy cricket set for his kids. I think there is always something rather magical about seeing any kind of performer living their "real" life.

Over the years I have come to love the unique smell of the city of Rotorua. Many people find it offensive, rather like rotten eggs, due to the







hydrogen sulphide, but I, like many people who have lived with it all their lives, rather enjoy the smell.

Any kind of road trip in New Zealand is pretty unique.

As soon as you leave the big cities you find yourself driving through beautiful unspoilt country-side with very little traffic. Old farms and home-steads are nestled into the green hillsides and small villages with their Four Square stores advertise Tip Top Ice Cream.

Every kilometre you drive brings new wonders, it is a fine example of nature at it's very best. Mountains, ancient forests, pristine beaches, volcanos, bubbling mud pools, lakes and rivers. Green fields full of cows and sheep. It is no wonder so many filmmakers have chosen to shoot their blockbuster movies here.

You can eat delicious fresh fish in various venues. I sampled some in a little boutique cinema in Field-

ing (a small market town in the Manawatu district that has won the award for New Zealand's Most Beautiful Town, sixteen times!)

Mangonui Fish Shop in the top of the North Island specialises in line caught fish bought directly off the boats, such as Snapper, Tarakhi, Gurnard and Hapuku. Here, you can sit in the little restaurant right on the waters edge, watching through an open window as your dinner is being cooked, whilst looking out for the Stingrays, John Dory, Kingfish, Bronzer Whale Sharks or pods of Orcas that often swim by the shop. Or if you prefer you can simply find a sandy beach to sit on to eat your delicious fish and chips from the paper wrapping and enjoy the sunset!

A trip down the West Coast of the South Island began with a flight from Auckland to Christchurch. Christchurch is a beautiful city, although much of it was partly destroyed by the dreadful earthquake in 2010.







After a few days exploring, which included side trips to Akaroa "the most French town in New Zealand" and Lyttelton "a port town and historic landing point for many colonial settlers" it was onto the TranzAlpine train, a wonderful five hour journey through snow- capped mountains, frozen rivers and undulating countryside.

Disembarking at Greymouth we picked up a hire car and drove down the West Coast, stopping at interesting places like Hokitika, Fox Glacier and Ships Creek, where we admired the wild black sandy beach with its huge piles of driftwood and kaka birds (large olive coloured parrots) sitting in the trees emitting their harsh grating calls. I wished we had had time to take a walk through the ancient Kahikatea swamp forest, as apparently it provides "a glimpse back in time to what much of the West Coast may have looked like prior to human settlement."

Traces of gold and coal mining, timber logging, the Pancake Rock formations, forests, limestone cliffs, canyons, caves and underground streams, together with a spectacular coastline, make this area an absolute must-see.

Then on towards Queenstown, Wanaka, Milford Sound, a drive with stunning vistas of mountains and lakes. It was rather like living in a book of picture postcards. Everywhere you looked the scenery was spectacular.

So many other highlights as you drive around this little country:

Magnificent pink and purple Lupins in the South island. Peonies in Blenheim. Larnach Castle. Hamilton Gardens. Art Deco Napier. Mount Cook. Arrowtown. Te Mata Peak. Sliding down huge sand dunes. Glorious sandy beaches everywhere with hardly anyone in sight. Muriwai Gannet Colony. Matakohe Museum with its fabulous display of Kauri Gum. The All Blacks. Hobbiton.

The list is endless. However long I live, I don't think I shall ever be bored living in this beautiful country.

Arranged marriages? Marriages formed by matchmakers? Who really did that? Is it just the stuff of stories? Or were matches really made?



Someone suggested I write myself a one-woman show to showcase my writing and performing talents, but I didn't want to. First, I didn't think I was good enough to write and perform a whole play all by myself - but if I wasn't good enough to do that how could I possibly be good enough to be in the big time productions? Second, I didn't have an extra few grand to put into a production - renting and theater, hiring a director etc. I did it anyway. I started working on the pieces in an acting class I was already paying for, and as friends heard about what I was doing and saw I was putting in the effort starting with nothing, support came. It was showtime, and like in the movie "La La Land" with Emma Stone, no one really showed up. But I kept working on it anyway, I'd come this far. The play eventually went on to a festival in New York City and won the Audience Choice Award.

I was thrilled that the play went to New York City, the mecca of theater this side of the pond, and thought for sure this recognition would lead to representation and more substantial work. It didn't. However, lots of women I spoke with were excited




about the idea of a book based on the play, a racy female empowerment romantic comedy.

# Hello Debra, welcome to The Relatable Voice magazine! Tell us a bit about yourself.



## Are you working on anything at the present time?


Just finished a film K.H.A.F. where I was a Producer and Actress along with a scene in Strange Angels both with my partner Jim.

Filling your cup is finding out who you truly are and what purpose you could serve in this life.


Filling your cup is choosing forgiveness over hurt.

## Hello Jackiem, when did you begin writing stories?



Basically, out of boredom, I began jotting down thoughts in my Evernote app. What started as random scribbles about a young girl on a distant planet rapidly became a narrative that captured my imagination. Without any experience as a writer, I let myself be carried away by the story unfolding at my fingertips. To my surprise, characters started emerging, plots thickened, and the world I was crafting grew richer with each passing city on my tour. Before I knew it, my pre-performance routine included immersing myself in this fictional universe, eager to pick up where I left off at the previous venue. It was a thrilling discovery, realizing that such boundless creativity could spring forth in those idle moments before taking the stage.

# How did you decide on science fiction as your genre for writing?

Science fiction has always had a gravitational pull on me, no pun intended! I've been enamored with tales of distant galaxies and suspiciously human-looking aliens ever since I was a young child. The endless possibilities of the universe, the technological marvels, and those really cool spaceship designs – how could I resist? The genre lets me ask the big "what ifs" and then answer them with, "Well, why not a laser-beam-powered toaster?" On a serious note, it provides a space to challenge norms and imagine futures both bright and bleak. But, hey, even in the bleakest futures, I bet they have some top-notch space coffee! It felt like the perfect playground for my ideas

# Tell us about your previous novel release, Minor Assassin.

Her father, Aaron, becomes an even more pivotal figure in this sequel. As he witnesses his daughter's brilliance and dedication, he becomes more in tune with her, especially when it comes to ground-breaking tech. Together, father and daughter are embroiled in ambitious projects to safeguard their world. Their interactions with the governing council of Cydnus are intricate and layered, with noticeable friction between Aaron and certain council members.

Enter Flindar, the head of the Cydnus World Council. His towering office provides a panoramic view of New Cebrenia, a city of chrome, glass, and steel, alive with movement. Under his leadership, however, the Council has grown divided and fraught with internal politics, challenging their unified front. His interactions with Aaron showcase a mix of desperation and hope, particularly around Project Viaka, a potential solution to Cydnus's growing energy needs. With Aaron's involvement, and Flindar's faith in him, the two plot a way to convince the rest of the council of Project Viaka's importance, despite the dangerous undercurrents of betrayal and political maneuvering.

Eros, another council member, is particularly challenging, adding an extra layer of tension to the storyline. He's kinda like the bad guy, but with a whole lot of power. He sits under Flindar as the Vice-chair. But his intentions are not the same!



As the narrative unfolds, we're reintroduced to a character—whose identity I'll keep under wraps for now—but let's say, their motives are intriguingly ambiguous.

Trust me, "Zarya: Episode II" is set to break new ground! I Hope!!LOL

# What themes can readers find in your new book, "Zarya Episode II: Sochi Unleashed"?

Man and Machine Collaboration. The mutual understanding and collaboration between Zarya and Sochi are evident. Sochi's evolution in intelligence and autonomy serves as a prime example of the increasing interdependence and blurred lines between organic beings and artificial entities. Their exchanges also hint at a potential power shift, where AI might, at times, act out of its programmed protocols for safety reasons.

<u>Recklessness vs. Responsibility.</u> Zarya's youthful exuberance, combined with her newfound control over drones, touches on the excitement of pushing boundaries. The thrill of the chase and the sheer delight in her newfound capabilities contrast sharply with the potential consequences of hacking advanced equipment. It's a delicate dance between seeking adventure and facing the potential repercussions of those actions.

Natural Wonder Amidst Technological Marvel. The interaction with the Skylarkon, a native creature of Cydnus, juxtaposed against the advanced tech on display (Al airboards, drones, etc.), paints a picture of a world where technology and nature coexist. This theme speaks to the balance that advanced civilizations must find between progress and respecting the environment.

<u>Friendship and Shared Adventur.</u> The camaraderie among Zarya, Kizzy, and Marco is apparent. Their shared sense of adventure, moments of awe (like witnessing the Skylarkons), and playful taunts underscore the importance of relationships, even in a technologically advanced setting.

Ethical Quandaries in a Digital Age. Sochi's ability to override and hack drones introduces ethical questions about the extent to which one should or can manipulate technology, especially if it's not theirs. This theme is reinforced by Kizzy's concerns

about hacking the new P7-14 weather bots and the potential legal implications.

<u>Security in an Advanced World.</u> The presence of security transports and sentinel drones paints a picture of a society that, while advanced, also grapples with ensuring law and order. The tension between personal freedom and systemic control becomes evident when Zarya and her friends have to evade these security measures.

## How long have you been playing the saxophone?

I've been playing the saxophone for 29 years. It's amazing to think it's been almost three decades since I first picked up the instrument. It has been a truly enriching journey filled with melodies and memories!

# Which do you enjoy the most, writing stories, producing music, or playing the saxophone?

That's a tough one! Each offers its own unique joy. Writing provides an escape, allowing me to dive deep into my wild imagination unfiltered. Producing music presents a creative challenge, while playing the saxophone is pure, soulful expression. However, if I had to choose, I'd lean towards playing the saxophone because it's the most direct conduit for my emotions. Thankfully, I don't have to choose!

# What advice would you offer to aspiring musicians and writers?

Stay authentic to your voice. In both music and writing, it's easy to get swayed by trends or external pressures. The most compelling stories and melodies come from the heart and soul. Remember that perseverance is key. Treat every rejection or hurdle as just a stepping stone toward your goals. Keep pushing for what you love doing, no matter what. Your time will come!

# How do you prepare for a new role, and do you have any specific acting techniques?

When preparing for a role, I study the script to see what kind of a person the character is, it's important to know what the entire film is about to know what your character is going to go through. I am a method actor, I want to be the character and feel the emotions the character would experience if it were real.





# Can you describe a challenging or emotionally demanding role you've played and how you approached it?

The most challenging role I played was an abusive, alcoholic mother. She was a smoker and I'm not so It was challenging but I studied smokers to make it at realistic looking as possible.

# What has been your favorite character to portray so far?

My favorite character to play is Mary Lou in a tv series. She is a tough, all business boxing gym owner, she's always taking control of the situation and doesn't put up with anything from anyone.

# Can you share some of the most valuable lessons you've learned throughout your career?

The most valuable lessons I've learned in the industry is to study the role you have been offered to make sure it's a role you are truly interested in portraying, stay true to yourself and never do a role that makes you feel uncomfortable. Always be kind and courteous and be on time and prepared with anything you would need or have been instructed to bring.





## In an industry that can be highly competitive, how do you stay motivated and resilient during times of rejection or setbacks?

I keep motivated when rejection or setbacks happen by keeping in mind that we don't always get every role we try for. Sometimes we can give the best performance but if we don't have that certain look or trait that they are looking for it doesn't matter how good our audition is and we can't take it personally. We have to just let that one go and keep pushing on and trying for the next one. There's a lot of competition out there, we won't get every role!

# What advice would you give to aspiring actors looking to build a successful career?

The best advice I can give to someone new to the industry is to make sure you are taking workshops and acting classes, start with being an extra on big sets to learn about the industry, and to network.

### What's next for you?

I am excited to be in a tv series that's a detective show. I will be playing a desk Sargent, it is called Vice Squad and is a franchise of different series in high crime areas. I'm in Vice Squad Nola.
